3. _____ Must be voluntary, and given without coercion, force, threats, or intimidation
4. _____ Any form of abuse that takes place in any relationship
5. _____ Harass or persecute (someone) with unwanted and obsessive attention
6. _____ Actual or attempted abuse of a position of vulnerability, power, or trust, for sexual purposes, including, but not limited to, profiting monetarily, socially or politically
7. _____ A consensual sexual or romantic relationship between an Employee and any Student or Employee over whom they exercise direct or otherwise significant authority
8. _____ Any act of harm in response to an actual or perceived harm
9. _____ Unwelcome verbal, nonverbal, or physical conduct of a sexual nature
10. _____ Any form of abuse that takes place in a relationship that is beyond friendship
11. _____ Kissing, Touching intimate body parts, fondling, intercourse, Penetration, no matter how slight, of the vagina or anus with an part or object, oral sex of a sex organ by another person
